Background:

Smart African Village Development Consortium is seeking qualified and experienced persons for this position. The organization is committed to reducing the burden of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) in Busoga Region, and is seeking a Technical Officer - Project Medical Officer to support its NCD control efforts.

Purpose:

The Project Nurse will provide nursing care and support to individuals and families affected by NCDs, and will work to strengthen community-based systems and structures to prevent and control NCDs.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Provide nursing care and support: Provide nursing care and support to individuals and families affected by NCDs, including health education, counseling, and referrals to health and social services.
